

- ✓ 70% of eligible costs
- ✓ Maximum €500,000
- ✓ Maximum 24 months



- EU-citizens shall **understand and use media critically** in order to counteract disinformation and fake news.
- Projects shall promote cross-border media literacy strategies and practices in Europe and take into account the current user habits of different age groups.
- Funding is provided to cross-border consortia that develop and disseminate best practices, offer innovative approaches and further training, and create new toolkits.
- Technologies such as AI are also to be taken into account.


